Day 1: Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe

Arrival in Victoria Falls and transfer to your lodge, rest of the day at leisure to explore the magic of the Falls. *A'Zambezi River Lodge or similar*

Day 2: Chobe National Park, Botswana

In the morning go on a guided tour of the Victoria Falls. Travel to Chobe National Park via Kasane, afternoon at leisure or try out some optional activities. *Chobe Safari Lodge or similar*

Day 3: Chobe National Park, Botswana

Early-morning game drive in Chobe National Park for spectacular game viewing. In the evening embark on a sunset boat cruise on the Chobe River watching the wildlife on the banks of the river. *Chobe Safari Lodge or similar*

Day 4: Hwange National Park, Zimbabwe

Cross the border to Zimbabwe and drive to Hwange National Park. Your first stop is a visit to a Wildlife Conservation Centre. In the evening, why not embark on an optional afternoon/evening game drive. *Elephant's Eye or similar*

Day 5: Hwange National Park, Zimbabwe

Full-day game drive in Hwange National

Park one of Africa's finest havens for wildlife. Travel through the grasslands and Mopane forest and observe massive herds of elephant in their natural habitat. *Elephant's Eye or similar*

Day 6: Lake Kariba, Zimbabwe

Lake Kariba is Africa's biggest man-made dam. Board a luxury houseboat and enjoy a sunset cruise to the Sengwe River, with plentiful game viewing along the way. *Zambezi Cruise Safaris or similar*

Day 7: Lake Kariba, Zimbabwe

Select either morning game viewing, guided walks on the shore, or fishing for the first half of the day. Finish off the day with a sunset beach barbecue on a secluded island in the lake. *Zambezi Cruise Safaris or similar*

Days 8 - 9: Matopos, Zimbabwe

Matobo is an area of granite hills and wooded valleys. Rhino-tracking is one of the most rewarding and exhilarating experiences one can have. At sunset we take in the breath-taking "World's View at Cecil John Rhodes' Grave. *Camp Amalinda or similar*

Day 10: Nata, Botswana

Travel into Botswana with an afternoon visit





to the Nata Bird Sanctuary; enjoy the vast open landscapes that these salt pans are known for. *Nata Lodge or similar*

Day 11: Ntsetwe Pan, Botswana

Ntsetwe Pan is among the largest salt pans in the world. We explore the area, in search of uniquely adapted desert species. *Planet Baobab or similar*

Day 12: Maun, Botswana

Arrival at Maun, day at leisure or book an optional flight over the Okavango Delta and view the meandering network of waterways from above. *Thamalakane River Lodge or similar*

Day 13: Greater Moremi, Botswana

Experience a traditional Mokoro excursion in lush marshlands of the Okavango Delta. In the afternoon go on a game drive in the Greater Moremi area. *Bedouin Bush Camp or similar*

Day 14: Moremi Game Reserve, Botswana

Full-day game drive in Moremi Game Reserve, which holds tremendous scientific, environmental and conservation importance. *Bedouin Bush Camp or similar*

Day 15: Maun, Botswana

Transfer back to Maun after breakfast, tour ends.
