Day 1: Arusha, Tanzania

Arrival in Tanzania and transfer from the airport to your accommodation. Rest of the day is spent at leisure to relax after your journey or if there is time partake in some optional activities. *Moivaro Coffee Plantation or similar*

Day 2: Lake Manyara, Tanzania

Pass through Arusha, for any last-minute purchases before travelling to Lake Manyara National Park. *Rift Valley Photographic Lodge or similar*

Day 3: Cultural experience nearby Manyara, Tanzania

Cultural diversity day, with a village tour of Mto-wa-Mbu. In the afternoon take a walking tour to Lake Papyrus. In the late afternoon visit the Maasai Boma for the cultural encounter of a lifetime. *Rift Valley Photographic Lodge or similar*

Day 4: Tarangire, Tanzania

Full-day game drives in Tarangire National Park which forms the centre of an annual migratory cycle that includes up to 3000 elephant, 25,000 wildebeest and 30,000 zebra. *Rift Valley Photographic Lodge or similar*

Days 5 - 7: Ngorongoro and Serengeti, Tanzania

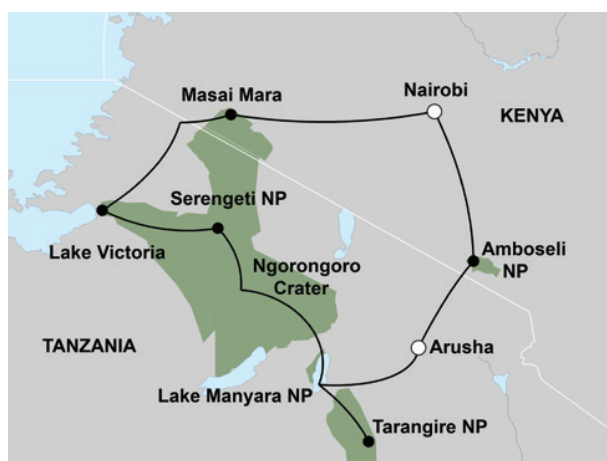
Early departure for a game drive in the world famous Ngorongoro Crater, after which we head off to the Serengeti through the endless plains in the southern part. The following two full days are spent exploring the park. *Kisura Kenzan Tented Camp or similar*

Day 8: Serengeti to Lake Victoria, Tanzania

Travel to Lake Victoria, the largest lake in Africa. Along the way we pass through the villages of the Sukuma Tribe who live a traditional life that hasn't changed much over the years. *Speke Bay Lodge or similar*

Days 9 - 10: Lake Victoria to Masai Mara, Kenya

After breakfast there is a boat excursion, weather permitting, to a local fishing village.

Depart after breakfast for the lively, cosmopolitan capital of Kenya. Along the way we visit the Kazuri Bead Factory, a community upliftment project that makes a vital difference in local women's lives. *Eka Hotel or similar*

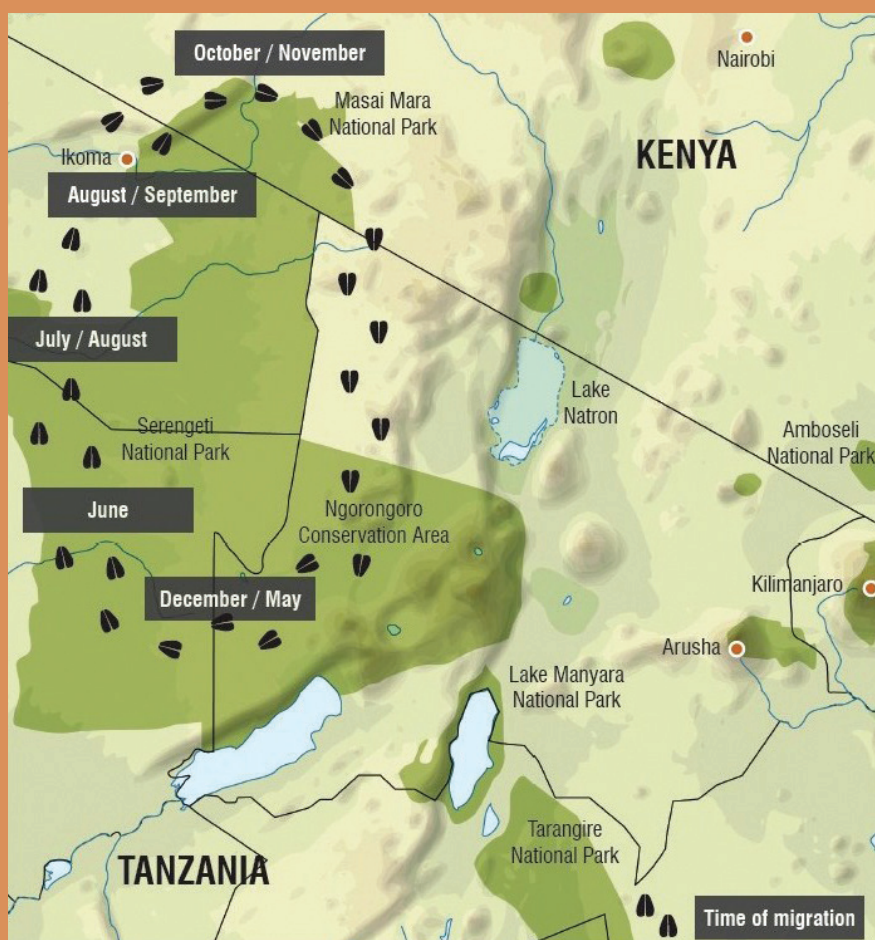
Days 12 - 13: Nairobi to Amboseli, Kenya

Explore Nairobi, visit the Karen Blixen Museum. Travel to the Amboseli National Park. The next day enjoy a full-day game drive in the park that is known for its large herds of elephant and impressive views of Mt Kilimanjaro. *Kibo Safari Camp or similar*

Days 14 - 15: Amboseli to Kilimanjaro, Tanzania

Travel to your lodge right by Kilimanjaro International Airport with a stop at the Marangu Waterfalls on Kilimanjaro along the way. Overnight at the lodge for an easy connection for the next morning's outbound flight. *Moivaro KIA Lodge*

Almost two million animals roam the plains of East Africa, but it can be surprisingly hard to find them in the vast area that they cover as their movement is governed by the rains and predicting their location can be a gamble.
